Dear Sir or Madam,
Madam has the right to reimbursement for IVF/ICSI treatment abroad. In the Netherlands, this treatment is conducted in a licensed institution. Therefore, the treatment is assessed on a number of criteria. In other countries, the same criteria are not necessarily applied. It will be assessed based on the following questionnaire whether the insured person is eligible for reimbursement.

2. Age of the insured person You may be eligible for IVF/ICSI abroad if your age is not over 42 years. If you are aged 43 or over, you no longer have the right to reimbursement for IVF/ICSI and other fertility-related treatment.
3. An insured person has the right to three attempts in total. What number of valid attempt is this IVF/ICSI treatment?

Explanation:

Both previous treatments in the Netherlands and previous treatments abroad count as attempts. A treatment counts as an attempt if upon puncture at least one ripe ovum is obtained. An interrupted treatment during the hormone treatment phase therefore does not count as an attempt; an obtained ovum with which no fertilisation was possible in the laboratory does indeed count as an attempt.

After a continuing pregnancy, whether or not it arose via IVF/ICSI, there is again a right to three attempts for a new desire for pregnancy. A continuing pregnancy is defined as a pregnancy with at least one living embryo, counted at least 10 weeks from the date of follicle puncture, or 12 weeks after the first day of the last menstruation. After a change of partner too, there is again the right to an IVF/ICSI treatment process of three attempts, if there is joint infertility.
